Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults.

Policy



- 1. Safeguarding is paramount, and is everyone's constant responsibility.
- 2. Wildside will safeguard all its user age groups, including vulnerable adults
- 3. Safeguarding will take precedence over the interests of Wildside, were there to be a conflict between the two.
- 4. Wildside's programmes aim to of educate and enthuse users – be they children, young people, or adults – supervised by vetted staff or volunteers.
- 5. Most of the staff and some of the volunteers will periodically have one-to-one contact with users. the children, young people or vulnerable adults.
- Wildside's practices aim to protect users children and vulnerable adults from 6. harm, and create a safer environment that promotes their wellbeing and security.
- 7. Wildside's employees and volunteers will recognise and accept the responsibility to develop awareness of issues which may cause harm.
- Wildside recognises and promotes each individual's right to be treated with 8. respect and dignity, and to live in safety.
- 9. Key staff and volunteers will undertake training on Safeguarding which will specifically include Child Protection procedures and the safeguarding of vulnerable adults.
- 10. As key part of the induction of all new staff and volunteers is safeguarding awareness including this of this policy.
- 11. Staff and volunteers who work with vulnerable persons in 'Regulated Activities' must have an up-to-date Disclosure and Barring Service certificate.
- 12. All allegations of improper conduct by staff or volunteers or visitors will be investigated; and if substantiated, appropriate disciplinary steps will be taken.
- 13. This policy will be reviewed annually and will include checks on accuracy of personnel details, and taking into account changes in local or national policy.
